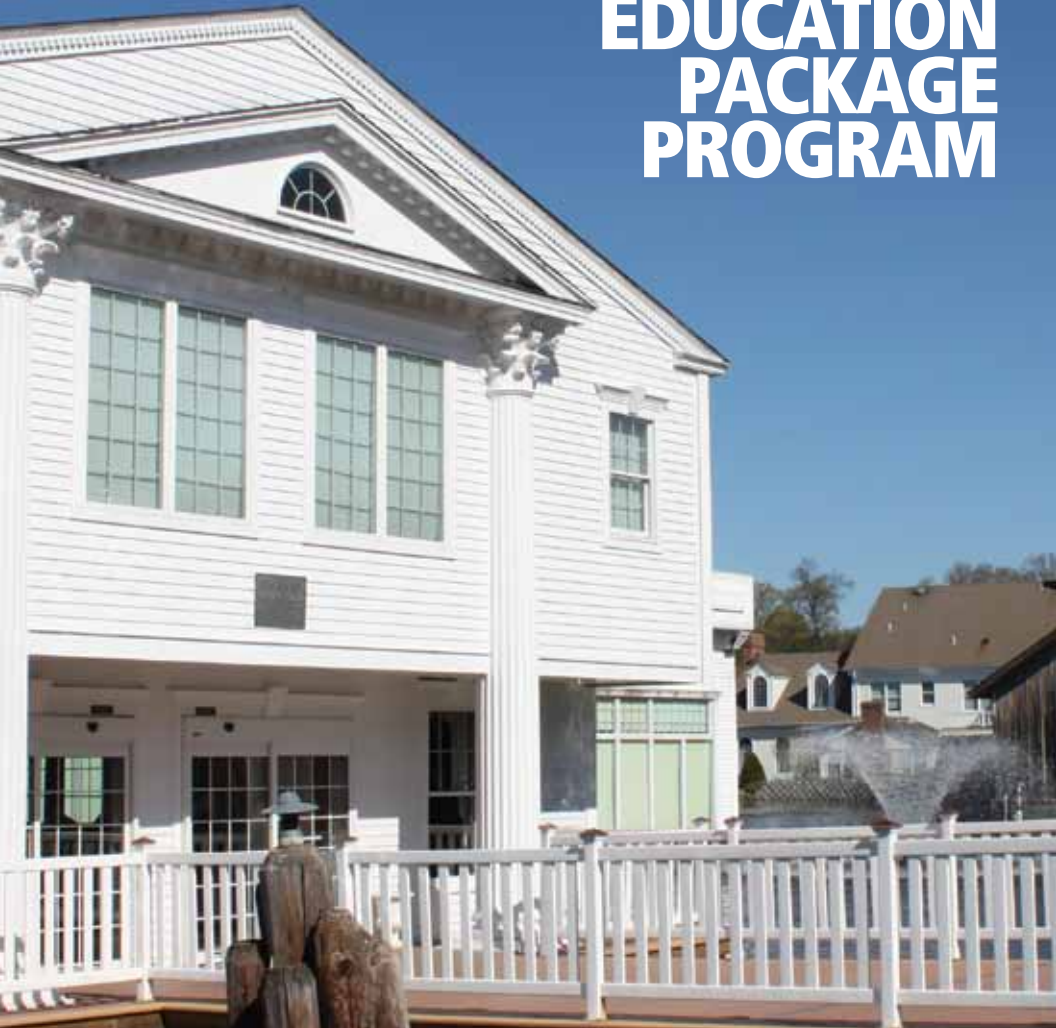

# The Art of Endodontics – System-Based Endodontics with the New GT Series X Files

Conventional endodontic treatment has undergone dramatic change in the last decade. Shaping procedures, which used to take years of training and hours of clinical time to accomplish, can now routinely be done by novices in less than five minutes with remarkably consistent results. Three-dimensional warm gutta percha obturation techniques, previously considered to be difficult, are now easier and can be done in less time than lateral condensation.

The excitement in dentistry over these amazing technical advances is palpable, yet belies the greater importance of basic procedural factors in achieving predictable endodontic success. Cutting safe, effective access cavities, negotiating root canals to their terminal points, and accurate determination of canal length must be accomplished at a high level or the shaping and filling outcomes are irrelevant to the success of the case.

This lecture will describe the concepts and techniques necessary for clinicians to experience their delivery of conventional endodontic treatment as an enjoyable and profitable part of their dental practices. Critical technique fundamentals will be explained and shown, as well as state-of-the-art advancements in instruments, materials, and technique nuance that can propel effective clinicians through several levels of higher performance.

Upon completion of this presentation, the attending clinician will have a greater understanding of the following:

- Access outline forms that conserve the most tooth structure yet still assure straight line access into each orifice.
- Negotiating techniques for consistently reaching a canal terminus including how to properly bend a file to get around impediments.
- Using apex locators to save time and increase the accuracy of length determination.
- The safe and efficient use of nickel-titanium files: When to use hand vs. handpiece-driven instruments.
- Shaping canals using the New GT Series X™ rotary files with M-Wire.
- The importance of lubricants, irrigants and chelating agents and when to use them.
- 3D Centered-Compaction Obturation techniques including:

- Tooth whitening, "in-office" and "take-home", how they work and what is best for your patients. Light-activated bleaching - the facts!
- Esthetic case maintenance.

# The Ultimate Cheat Sheets Lecture: The Practical Guide for Dentists

Part 1 is an update of the course given to the CSDA in 2008. This CHAIRSIDE FRIENDLY course is for the clinician seeing patients on a daily basis. It will focus on the principle drugs prescribed by dentists including Antibiotics for Acute Infections and for all Antibiotic Prophylaxis situations; including intra-cardiac devices, vascular grafts, dialysis accesses, the myriad intravenous devices, prosthetic joints and hydrocephalus shunts. Analgesics Protocols for post operative pain and Local Anesthetic options with important drug-drug interactions will be emphasized. The dentist is faced with an aging population with a myriad of medical problems and physician prescribed medications. The purpose of this course, is to provide the dentist a framework for choosing antibiotics, analgesics, anesthetics and other TOP 50 DENTAL PRESCRIPTIONS in the context of potential Drug-Drug Interactions and Disease related complications for the Medically Compromised Patient.

Part 2 will be an evidence based discussion of the Dental Treatment Planning process. What are the comparative prognoses for fixed bridgework, implants or retention of periodontally questionable teeth? Can a soft tissue management program improve prognosis for all three options? What are the specific dental procedures needed in the armamentarium? What specific medical conditions or medications bias the treatment plan?

# Contemporary Implant Dentistry and Oral Surgery: Advances in Surgical and Prosthetic Patient Management

The use of dental implants in the previous two decades has created many new and exciting possibilities in the prosthetic treatment of our patients. Restoring form and function with dental implants has become a routine procedure in many dental practices. Treatment may vary from the replacement of a single tooth to the reconstruction of a totally edentulous mouth.

Oral surgical care has also improved greatly with the advent of newer instrumentation and better pharmaceuticals, making tooth extraction and removal of impacted third molars much less traumatic.

This upbeat course will explore many of the important parameters and challenges of creating esthetic and functional restorations supported by dental implants. The clinical material will cover each of the categories listed below as well as provide supporting clinical evidence covering a span of the last 20 years.

- Single tooth restorations
- Site development - when and why to bone graft
- Immediate implant loading
- Edentulous maxilla and mandible
- Atraumatic tooth extraction
- Marketing and managing your busy implant practice

He has consulted with numerous manufacturers' in product development and refinement and is on the editorial board of Practical Procedures & Aesthetic Dentistry, Contemporary Esthetics, Signature, and is the past editor of the Journal of the American Academy of Cosmetic Dentistry. He is also the current clinical editor of the Dental Practice Report, as well as a member of the Esthetic Dentistry Research Group, which publishes REALITY and REALITY NOW. He is an accredited member and Fellow of the American Academy of Cosmetic Dentistry. He was the founder and past director of P.A.C.~live, and The Hornbrook Group. He has lectured internationally on all facets of esthetic dentistry and has published articles in all of the leading dental journals.

**DR. LOU GRAHAM** is an internationally recognized lecturer extensively involved in continuing education for dental professionals, focusing on incorporating current clinical advancements through "conservative dentistry." He emphasizes in his teachings the same concepts he practices: dental health diagnosis, treatment plans for medically compromised patients, conservative treatment, cosmetic dentistry, and customized approaches to periodontal care, implants and laser dentistry. He enjoys providing dental care at his private practice, University Dental Professionals, in Chicago, IL – Hyde Park.

**DR. L. STEPHEN BUCHANAN** was valedictorian of his class at the University of the Pacific School of Dentistry, and completed the Endodontic Graduate program at Temple University in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania in 1980. Dr. Buchanan began pursuing 3-D anatomy research early in his career, and in 1986 he became the first person in dentistry to use micro CT technology to show the intricacies of root structure. In 1989 he established Dental Education Laboratories, and subsequently built a state-of-the-art teaching laboratory devoted to hands-on endodontic instruction, where he continues to teach today. Through Dental Education Laboratories he has lectured and conducted participation courses around the world, published numerous articles, and produced an award-winning video series, The Art of Endodontics. In addition to his activities as an educator and practicing clinician, Dr. Buchanan holds a number of patents for dental instruments and techniques. Most notably, he was the first to introduce variably-tapered shaping instruments for use in endodontic therapy and pioneered a system-based approach to treating root canals. He is a diplomate of the American Board of Endodontics and a fellow of the International and American Colleges of Dentistry. He also serves as an assistant clinical professor at the University of Southern California School of Dentistry and at the University of California, Los Angeles School of Dentistry. Dr. Buchanan also maintains a private practice limited to endodontics and implant surgery in Santa Barbara, California.

**DR. GERARD KUGEL** is the Associate Dean for Research, and Professor of Prosthodontics and Operative Dentistry at Tufts University School of Dental Medicine. With an expertise in Clinical Research and Esthetic Dentistry, he is a reviewer for The New England Journal of Medicine, JADA, The Journal of Esthetic and Restorative Dentistry, and the Clinicians Report. He is on the Editorial Board of Functional Esthetics & Restorative Dentistry, The Journal of Cosmetic Dentistry, and The Journal of Adhesive Dentistry and he is Editor -in- Chief of Inside Dentistry. He is a Fellow in the American and International Colleges of Dentistry as well as the Academy of General Dentistry and the Academy of Dental Materials. Dr Kugel is on the Board of Directors of the CR Foundation and has his M.S. in Anatomy and Cellular Biology and his Ph.D. in Dental Materials. Dr. Kugel has published over 120 articles and over 200 abstracts in the field of restorative materials and techniques. He was given over 300 lectures both nationally and internationally. Dr. Kugel is part of a group practice, the Boston Center for Oral Health, located in Back Bay, Boston.

**DR. ROBERT FAZIO** is Associate Clinical Professor of Surgery at Yale University School of Medicine. He maintains a private practice limited to Periodontology, Implants and Oral Medicine. His "Ultimate Cheat Sheets – The Practical Guide for Dentists" was the CLINICIAN REVIEW NEWSLETTER's "Best Educational Product of 2008 AND 2009". He is among Dentistry Today's top 100 clinician lecturers for 2008 and 2009.

**DR. DEWITT WILKERSON** was a 1982 graduate of the University Of Florida College Of Dentistry, the year he joined the Dawson group practice in St. Petersburg, Florida. Dr. Wilkerson is the Director of Dental Medicine and a senior lecturer at the Dawson Academy. He is a Fellow in the American College of Dentists, a member of the American Academy of Restorative Dentistry, American Equilibration Society (2010-2011 President), and numerous other professional organizations. He serves as an adjunct professor in the Graduate Program, University of Florida College of Dentistry. Dr. Wilkerson lectures extensively nationally and internationally on the subjects of Restorative Dentistry, Occlusion and Masticatory System Disorders.

**DR. LOUIS CLARIZIO** is in private practice in Portsmouth, New Hampshire at the Oral Surgery & Dental Implant Center. He is Assistant Clinical Professor at the University of Illinois Dental School, and Adjunct Clinical Professor at Southern Illinois University Dental School. He has been a Diplomat of the American Board of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons since 1989. He is a graduate of Northwestern University with a BS in Biomedical Engineering. Dr. Clarizio received his DDS degree from Northwestern University Dental School; Ranked second in his class; American College of Dentists Award of Merit Recipient for outstanding senior dental student. He completed externships in OMS at the University of Miami-Jackson Memorial Hospital under Dr. Stuart Kline; University of Erlangen in Numberg, Germany under Prof Dr. Emil Steinhauer; Gemeente Ziekenhaus, Amhem, Netherlands under PJW Stoelinga DDS MD, PA Blijdorp DDS MD, JGAE Schoenaers DDS MS. His residency in OMS was at the University of Connecticut Health Center. He has published many articles over the past 10 years and his research interests include biomechanics in implant design, progressive provisional loading to alter bone physiology, implant prosthetics, bone grafting techniques and single-stage implants. He has been speaking at national meetings since 1996.
