Life is Not a Stress Rehearsal

Stress has become a metaphor for daily life and a way of defining ourselves. Conversations are saturated with remarks about how and what we have to do to the exclusion of fun, which comes at the end of a daunting schedule. Technology has added fuel to the fire by making it possible to constantly be “in touch” therefore giving the brain no respite from its incessant chatter. The byproducts of a stress filled life can leave our brains and bodies compromised. It is estimated that stress has become a 5 billion dollar a year industry. Most individuals believe that stress is someone or something that must be changed or altered in order to get relief. However relief only comes from truly understanding that the problem most often comes from “faulty thinking” and the choices that are made as a result. We all know that progress is a fact of life and that we need to be vigilant about having shelter, clothing and food to sustain us and hopefully have enough left over to do those things we enjoy. However, it is possible to live “the good life” without living a life that is filled with daily catastrophising and awful zing.

Course Objectives:

- Help develop skills that will increase the individuals’ awareness of how their internal critic creates their stress levels.
- The difference between “distress and eustress.”
- Explore how the brain and body become compromised from “distress.”
- How to counter cognitive distortions through reframing and healthy distractions.
- Developing ways to step away from unhealthy behaviors by seeing more humor, compassion and effective ways to communicate.

Avoid Liability: Know Your Patient's Medications and Their Impact on Dental Treatment!

This six hour program will be divided into two sections. The morning discussion includes the indications, contraindications, and side effects of the most commonly prescribed medications. Ask yourself this question: Are there any medications used in my dental office that could adversely interact with drugs the patient is taking? These medications represent 30% of all prescription medications taken by your dental patients. Familiarity with these drugs will provide the dental practitioner with a better appreciation for the health profile of today's dental patient.

The afternoon session provides information for controlling post-operative dental pain. When is it safe to discontinue aspirin in a patient? Is it safe to prescribe the NSAIDs in patients with cardiovascular disease or who have been prescribed ACE inhibitors? What are the indications and contraindications for the use of opiate analgesics? How can I combine local anesthetics with analgesics to minimize post-operative pain? These questions and more will be answered in this fast-paced, entertaining, and highly informative six hour lecture.

Course Objectives:

- The medications that could adversely interact with dental drugs.
- Why your patient is taking their medications.
- What oral side effects may be caused by these drugs.
- The maximum doses for commonly prescribed pain medications.
- When not to prescribe NSAIDs.
- How to combine medications to maximize their effects.
- The mechanism of action of the commonly prescribed analgesics.
- The indications and contraindications for opiate analgesics.

Connecticut Society of Periodontists

6 CREDITS- FOUR 90-MINUTE LECTURES

DR. ROBERT TREADO- "SOFT TISSUE GRAFTING FOR ROOT COVERAGE"

This lecture will highlight connective tissue grafting and acellular dermal matrix grafting for root coverage. There will be a review of different classifications of gingival recession, causes of gingival recession lesions, historical perspective on procedures used for root coverage, rationale for using one technique versus the other, advantages and disadvantages of each procedure, when treatment is necessary and surgical procedure for each technique.

DR. RONALD DELVECCHIO- "PERIODONTALLY ACCELERATED OSTEOGENIC ORTHODONTICS (WILKODONTICS)"

This innovative combination of a selective periodontal plastic surgical procedure with orthodontic treatment results in an acceleration of the orthodontic treatment, enhanced stability of the orthodontic results and a long term improvement of the periodontium. The lecture will cover an explanation of the background and research, literature review to support the treatment and an overview of the procedure with case presentation of different orthodontic cases. Full mouth and localized procedures will be discussed.

DR. CARY A SHAPOFF- "AN UPDATE ON PERIODONTAL DISEASES- PERIODONTICS IN 2012"

This presentation will discuss an overview of the most common periodontal diseases you will encounter in your dental practice. Establishing a proper diagnosis is the first step in creating a successful treatment plan to effectively address these periodontal conditions. Diagnosis is determined after a thorough collection of relevant historical, clinical and radiographic data. There will be a review of the newest techniques to control and correct inflammatory periodontitis, gingival recession and alveolar ridge atrophy following tooth extraction. Many new biologic modalities are now available to help regenerate and restore lost alveolar bone and gingival tissue.

DR. MICHAEL SONICK- "PREDICTABLE DIAGNOSIS AND TREATMENT OF CLINICAL CROWN AND GINGIVAL ARCHITECTURE DISCREPANCIES: INNOVATIVE STRATEGIES IN ANTERIOR TOOTH AESTHETICS"

Comprehensive treatment planning of the aesthetic restorative case can be challenging. Ideal treatment involves treatment of the teeth, gingiva and bone. The key to success is to understand and develop predictable strategies in patient care. What works and doesn't work? Dr Sonick will discuss the thought process, communication methods and techniques necessary in order to achieve ideal esthetic and healthy prosthetic reconstruction of the maxillary anterior region.

Treating Aging America: Time to “Doctor-Up!”

Clinical patient management of aging/special needs patients can be both challenging and blessed. With the tsunami of aging patients and intricacies of their care, our dental teams must “Doctor-Up” to meet their needs. Clinical patient management, standards of care, when, where, and how to treat, when not to treat, treating difficult denture patients, new extraction techniques, and funding sources will be discussed. The “Deadly Five” conditions that stop or delay care will be presented as well as answers to many dental, prevention medical, pharmacological and psychological concerns. Strategies for in-office treatment of nursing facility patients as well as prosthetic care for the geriatric patient will be presented. By attending, your ability to safely and effectively treat this population in the general dental office will be improved and your opportunities to truly “doctor” these wonderful patients will be enhanced.

- The “Deadly Five” conditions that stop or delay provision of care.
- When, where, and how to treat Geriatric patients and/or special need adults.
- Potentially adverse dental, medical, pharmacological, and psychological concerns and how to handle them.
- Prevention strategies for geriatric patients.
- Goals of prosthetic care for geriatric patients.
- Clinical tips, materials, and strategies that enhance the entire dental teams ability to treat this population.
- How to truly be a “Doctor” to a wonderful, needy and loving group of patients.

Advanced Pediatric Dental Procedures

GREGORY PSALTIS DMD
6 CREDITS

Basic fillings are not the challenge of pediatric dentistry. When primary teeth are more involved with decay, it becomes necessary to know how to deliver stainless steel crowns. In this course, a step-by-step explanation will enable practitioners to provide this critical procedure with ease. Primary tooth pulp therapy is another aspect of advanced care that will be fully covered, ranging from indirect pulp-capping to pulpotomies to pulpectomies. A variety of medicaments for these procedures will be presented. When a primary tooth cannot be restored, space maintenance becomes the next step. All forms to passive space maintainers plus some active appliances will be taught. One last critical aspect of care for children is local anesthesia. In addition to some techniques, surprising information about maximum doses will help practitioners to understand the importance of awareness of a child's body weight in determining appropriate selection of types of agents and amounts. This comprehensive program will enable dental professionals who routinely see children to provide a broader range of appropriate care with greater facility.

Course Objectives:

- Learn new techniques and materials for primary pulp therapy
- Discover how effective stainless steel crowns are and how to do them
- Understand which space maintainers are indicated for different situations
- Know what prioritization and sequencing are in planning children's visits

Lessons of the Downturn: Ethics, Esthetics, and Endodontics

DAN FISCHER DDS
6 CREDITS

Dr. Fischer's one-day course provides an abundance of ideas and techniques to enhance your practice while accommodating the needs of all patients. It demonstrates how the use of technology enables you to provide affordable, quality treatments, improving your patient's lives and your bottom line. It also emphasizes minimally invasive, repairable esthetics and early childhood preventative intervention.

This course addresses the needs of the entire dental team, and focuses on practical, useful information, such as revolutions in tooth bleaching and alternatives to the rubber dam in particular cases of direct esthetic restorations.

Over the last three decades, dental treatment options and patient expectations have evolved and changed. Dr. Fischer has witnessed this and recognizes that new technologies have been the principle drivers of these changes. In this course, he will disclose tips he has learned throughout his dental career, and demonstrate – with clinical evidence – how modern materials and treatment developments have enabled today's dentists to “go where our predecessors only dreamed.”

Course Objectives:

- Treat a broader range of socio-economic groups without negatively impacting their bottom lines.
- Intervene with children early enough to help prevent childhood caries.
- Recognize the principles of quality adhesives and esthetic resins for direct reconstruction of fractured anterior teeth.
- Understand tooth whitening and bleaching, and answer the following questions, among others: How young is too young? How does one treat various types of stains? What are the treatment options for fluorosis? What is the mechanism of the peroxide whitening process?
- Hone techniques for direct reconstructions of mutilated posterior teeth.
- Integrate endodontics into their practices, including such procedures as: sealing root canals with radiopaque, hydrophilic resins and preparing the post channel within four minutes, in the same appointment.

ABOUT THE SPEAKERS

DR. GORDON J. CHRISTENSEN is Founder and Director of Practical Clinical Courses (PCC) in Utah, an international continuing education organization providing courses and videos for all dental professionals. Dr. Christensen has presented over 45,000 hours of continuing education throughout the world and has published many articles and books. Gordon and Dr. Rella Christensen are co-founders of the non-profit Gordon J. Christensen CLINICIANS REPORT (previously CRA) and since 1976 they have conducted research in all areas of dentistry and published the findings to the profession. Gordon's degrees include: DDS, University of Southern California; MSD, University of Washington; PhD, University of Denver; an Honorary Doctor of Science from Utah State University, and an honorary Doctor of Dental Education and Research from Utah Valley University.

LORETTA LAROCHE is an international stress management and humor consultant whose wit, and irreverent humor, has, for over 30 years raised the humor potential in all of us. Loretta is founder and president of The Humor Potential, Inc, a company offering programs and products for life style management. Her special brand of optimistic psychology has an incontestable positive effect on the health of all that are exposed to her. Organizations worldwide use Loretta's prescription for laughter to manage stress in the workplace and improve morale. She has had seven one-woman television specials air on 80 PBS stations across the country. Her 7th special, Juicy Living Juicy Aging aired on PBS August of 2009. She has been nominated for local and prime time Emmy Awards, has appeared on CNN, ABC and NBC affiliates. She has authored 8 books, The Joy Journal, Happy Talk, Relax: You May Only Have a Few Minutes Left, Life is Not a Stress Rehearsal and, Life Is Short- Wear Your Party Pants, Squeeze the Day, Kick Up Heels Before You're Too Short to Wear Them and her newest book Lighten Up.

DR. HAROLD L. CROSSLEY is Professor Emeritus at the University of Maryland Dental School. A native of Rhode Island, he received a Bachelor of Science degree in Pharmacy from the University of Rhode Island in 1964. Dr. Crossley has co-authored a number of articles and four books dealing with a variety of topics within the field of pharmacology. Other areas of expertise include the pharmacology of street drugs and chemical dependency. He serves on the Maryland State Dental Association's Well-Being Committee. He is an active member of Phi Kappa Phi, Omicron Kappa Upsilon Honorary Dental Society, the American College of Dentists, and International College of Dentists. He was the recipient of the 2008 Gordon Christensen Lecturer Recognition award presented by the Chicago Dental Society. He has been a consultant for the United States Drug Enforcement Administration and other law enforcement agencies since 1974.

DR. ROBERT TREADO received his DMD from the University of Connecticut, completing his specialized Periodontal training from the University of Connecticut in 1980. Dr Treado became a Diplomate of the American Board of Periodontology in 1986. He was a clinical instructor at the University of Connecticut Dental School in the undergraduate and graduate Periodontal programs for 10 years before devoting all his time to his full time practice. He is in private practice in Bristol, Connecticut.

DR. CARY A. SHAPOFF has been in the private practice of periodontics since 1977. He devotes his time to a full-time practice of periodontics and dental implant surgery in Fairfield, Connecticut. He graduated from Case Western Reserve University and Case Western Reserve School of Dentistry. He completed a surgical internship at Bethesda Naval Hospital from 1972-73 and completed his residency in Periodontics at the University of Maryland. He also served in the U.S. Navy as the Dental officer on USS Coronado (LPD-11) from 1973-75.

DR. RONALD DEL VECCHIO received his dental degree at NYU College of Dentistry. He attended Tufts University where he received his periodontal certificate, attained board certification in 1981 and has a specialty practice in periodontics and dental implants. He has served as president of his local society (TDA) and of his state periodontal society (CSP) and has been a long standing member of the ADA, CSDA, AAP and AO societies. He has lectured on periodontal treatment and AAO: accelerated osteogenic orthodontics locally and at the state CSDA meeting. One of the first dentists to receive training in the use of AAO, he has practiced it for the last 10 years with his orthodontic colleagues.

DR. MICHAEL SONICK is a full time practicing periodontist and implant surgeon in Fairfield, Connecticut. He is a on the Editorial Boards of the Compendium of Continuing Dental Education, Inside Dentistry, Dental XP, Journal of Cosmetic Dentistry and the Journal of Implant and Advanced Clinical Dentistry. He currently is a Guest Lecturer at New York University School of Dentistry in their international dental program and is founder and director of Sonick Seminars, an advanced training center for practicing dentists. He provides a series of live surgical courses with hands on components in his on site teaching center in Fairfield, Connecticut. Dr. Sonick is the founder and director of the Fairfield County Dental Club, an advanced continuing education organization that provides courses on the latest developments in dentistry to dentists, hygienists, and dental staffs.

DR. GREGORY FOLSE is a true advocate for vulnerable patient populations around the world. He passionately treats, and helps others to treat, our county's most vulnerable populations – poor children and Aged, Blind, and Disabled adults. He maintains a mobile, geriatric dental practice in Lafayette, Louisiana, a comprehensive school-based dental practice throughout Louisiana, and lectures extensively. He graduated from LSU Dental School in 1989 and completed the Geriatric Dental Fellowship Program at Baylor in 1999. He is currently working with the American Dental Association (ADA), the U. S. House and Senate, Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS), and Special Care Dentistry (SCD) to nationally improve the oral health of vulnerable populations. He is the original author of the Special Care Dentistry Act, a federal bill requiring oral health services for Aged, Blind, and Disabled Medicaid eligible adults.

DR. GREG PSALTIS has been a pediatric dentist for 31 years in private practice in Olympia, Washington. He is well published and lectures frequently on various dental topics. His unique speaking style reflects his years of experience and his keen observations, thus making his programs both informative and entertaining.
